

In Word, go to Tools \rightarrow Language and select French. This will allow you to check spelling and grammar in French.

For accents on Macintosh:

Accent grave(à)

Hold down the option key and press `, and then the letter.

Accent aigu (á)

Hold down the **option** key and press e, and then the letter.

Accent circonflexe (â)

Hold down the **option** key and press I, and then the letter.

Cé cédille (ç)

Hold down the **option** key and press c.

References for accents are also in the LRC, or you could ask the lab monitor for help.

Recording

To record audio, open **Audio Recorder**, from the applications at the bottom of the screen. Microphones are on the left side of the computer. Make sure they are turned on, as indicated by a green light on the power button.

Press **Record** to start recording, **Pause** if you wish to pause in between paragraphs or sentences, and **Stop** when you have finished recording.

Pressing Stop will allow you to save your recording as an mp3. Save the file as your name or your username and choose to save on the **Desktop** from the dropdown menu below.
